Speaker- Dr. Anant Chakradeo, Pro Vice Chancellor, MIT ADT University, Pune, India

He started with the MIT ADT University Strategic Priorities. The key points of his discussion are as follows

- Provide Multi cultural and global environment to students
- Provide stay abroad opportunities
- Focus on International Collaboration
- Student and faculty Exchange Programs
- International Student Projects

He also spoke about the developing collaborations in research and teaching between academic staff, Developing strategic partnerships with leading universities. He discussed about the need to know how international market works.

He discussed about the role of Stakeholders in Internationalization.

Following are the key points of discussion

- Awareness among the students about the opportunities, work visa procedures

- Understanding the ever evolving policies from UGC / AICTE , law of land.

The next point in his topic was requirements to be a Global Citizen.

- Knowing multiple languages
- Understanding various cultures
- Understanding the Mobility Procedures
- Dignity for labour in other countries

In his next point Dr. Anant Chakradeo discussed about the Global curriculum requirements

- Changes at local end
- Credit system
- Mapping Possibility
- Evaluation Processes
- Timeline alignment

### **Session 2 - Internationalized Degree Profiling**

Speaker - **Dr. Chetan Singai**, Professor, Ramaiah University of Applied Sciences and Chief Consultant- National Curriculum Framework-2022, Ministry of Education, Govt. of India, Delhi

In the Session 2 Dr. Chetan Singai Strated his session with broad Introduction of Internationalized Degree Profiling. The session discussed the following parts.

- Why should we talk about curriculum internationalization
- Path of Internationalization of curriculum
- Global Profiling

While speaking ababout curriculum internationalization he said Student become confident working in different countries around the world also they get quality education. Also the HEIs will get the Global Reputation

The Important aspect he told that “we must need to develop our own curriculum rather tan borrowing from somewhere else”. He also define the process of globalization i.e. ( Purpose, Function or delivery of post secondary education. While speaking about internationalization at home he also put his views on Glocal approach.

Following were the key points in his topic “Profiling Internationalization at HEIs”

- Internationalization at home – staff/Faculty Incentives & Support
- Strategy/ Regulations/Structure

- Quality Assurance for Internationalization at home
- Internationalization Curriculum / Classroom
- Support of International Students
- Social Integration

He addressed about the International degree with Local, National & Global Context. Along with the Assessment, Integration & Practices as a Context.

### **Session 3 - Evaluation & Implementation of Internationalized Curriculum**

Speaker - Dr. Suman Kapur Senior Professor, Department of Biological Sciences, BITS, Hyderabad, Telangana, India

She started with the Thank you note for inviting her as a speaker for this International workshop.

During her session she covered some of the Important aspects of Internationalization of higher education.

- The drivers of the Internationalization of higher education
- The special features of International Higher Education
- Motivations for Internationalization of Higher education

She also kept her views about Internationalization of Higher education. She said we must have students from different countries, also we have faculties from different origin of Countries. We must develop of adopt curriculum either by ourselves or from the partner universities. Also the location of curriculum delivery center must not be off shore.

While speaking about Internationalization of higher education she said it is the top stage of international relations among universities and it is no longer regarded as a goal in itself but as a means to improve the quality of education She also speak about the seven aspects of knowledge translation and benefits of Internationalization of higher education.

The another Important topic in her Session was “The drivers of the Internationalization for higher education”

- Technology and Social Media
- Air Travel

In this session she also expresses her views about Special features of Internationalization of higher education. And how we prepare students to become highly employable global citizens.

- International student recruitment
- International Student support and Integration
- Internationalization of the faculty

After that she spoke about the three stages of the internationalization of the higher education

- Export education/ distance learning
- Franchise ( Collaborative, provision, twinning ) / validation
- International Branch Campus


























